Matthias Brewer completed his undergraduate education at the University of Vermont where he carried out research with Professor A. Paul Krapcho. He received his Ph.D. in 2002 from the University of Wisconsin-Madison where he worked with Professor D. H. Rich on the synthesis of botulinum neurotoxin metalloproteinase inhibitors. Following an NIH-NRSA Postdoctoral Fellowship with Professor L. E. Overman at the University of California-Irvine, Dr. Brewer joined the faculty at the University of Vermont in 2005 as an Assistant Professor and was subsequently promoted to Associate Professor in 2011. His research interests include the development of new synthetic methods, the synthesis of natural products, and the synthesis of biologically active compounds. In 2008 Dr. Brewer was awarded a CAREER award from the National Science Foundation.
