CAS Internship Program

Summer Internship Scholarship Program

Since summer 2015, the College of Arts & Sciences has provided students with internship scholarships to help them cover living expenses while taking on unpaid opportunities. Over that time, we have been able to fund 40% of applicants and meet 37% of total monetary ask. Your support would allow us to support more students doing internships during the summer months--a key time in a student's career in which they have the freedom to explore outside the classroom.

Arts in Action: New York City

A semester-long socially engaged experience in New York City with a focus on community, art, and activism. Students spend 3-4 days per week interning at artist studios, museums, theaters, and community arts organizations while exploring and understanding issues of inequality, diversity, and social justice. Students complete two academic courses and earn a full semester's worth of credit.

The Washington Center: D.C.

UVM partners with the nation's largest internship organization, The Washington Center, to send students to D.C. for internships in a wide variety of interest areas. UVM students live and work alongside students from across the country while earning a full semester's worth of credit.

Semester in the City: Boston

UVM partners with the College for Social Innovation's Semester in the City program to send students to Boston for internships in the nonprofit and social sectors. On top of their internship, students complete courses in social innovation and entrepreneurship to help them find connections between their liberal arts education and helping professions.

Communities of Practice

In CAS's Communities of Practice (COP) internship program, interns work in teams to build their skills while completing work in a professional setting for external organizations. Some will work 1:1 with an organization, while others will focus on a particular project or group of projects for community partners. Each COP cohort is lead by a professional currently working in their field.

Internship Program Fund

The College of Arts & Sciences Internship & Experiential Learning program relies on donor funds to cover program costs and expenses that interns may incur as part of their unpaid internships (transportation, research costs, etc.)

Summer Internship Scholarship \$3,100
Cover living expenses (rent, food, travel, etc.) for a student doing a summer unpaid internship in their chosen field.

Signature Summer Internship \$2,600
Help cover an intern's living expenses while they work with one of our community partner sites: the Burlington Free Press, Vermont Public Radio, and the Fleming Museum. *Host site pays the student another \$2,500.*

Arts in Action: New York City \$9,630
Cover a student's housing fee while they intern for a full semester in New York City's arts community. Students earn a full semester's worth of credit and work for at least 30 hours per week at an unpaid internship.

The Washington Center: D.C. \$6,570
Cover a student's housing fee while they work for 32 hours per week in Washington D.C. at an internship site of their choice. Students earn a full semester's worth of credit.

Semester in the City: Boston \$4,000
Cover a student's housing fee while they intern for 32 hours per week in Boston's social sector and explore careers in social change and non-profits. Students earn a full semester's worth of credit.

Communities of Practice \$3,000
Help launch a new Community of Practice (COP) program! Your donation allows us to compensate a COP instructor to develop and secure 20 internship placements in advance of the start of a new COP.

Intern Program Intern \$500	Travel Stipend \$250
Contribute toward a paid intern working with Internship Program staff.	Help a student cover gas to get to and from their internship site.

Course Materials \$100	Research Fees \$50
Help cover tools used by students in the Communities of Practice Program (audio editing, transcription software, etc.)	Help cover information access requests for interns completing research projects for internship sites.
