WHAT IS AN INTERACTIVE SYLLABUS?

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Students review prior to the first class session.



An interactive series of pages that requires students to "understand and acknowledge [the] information" in the syllabus.

A way to gauge student attitudes about course policies.



A means to collect some information about why the students are in the course and information about them that may alter the way [you] teach the course.

SMALL GROUP ACTIVITY

Review an example interactive syllabus, prepared to come back to the group with a response to one or more of these prompts:

- Did you have an "aha" moment?
- Did something surprise you?
- Were you inspired by something
- Did you react with questions? (What are they?)
