Pre-Existing Conditions: How Lobbying Makes American Health Care More Expensive

This monograph uses interview evidence and quantitative data from all 50 states to show how health care interest groups restrict legislative agendas, resulting in higher health care costs.

Legislative Capacity, Term Limits, and Group Involvement

This paper investigates how a reduction in staff changed how interest groups helped California legislators write bills in 1990 (with Mary Kroeger, University of North Carolina).

Bicameralism and Legislative Professionalism

This paper introduces a dataset with the legislative history of more than 180,000 bills in the states to show how a legislature's professionalism affects the enactment rates of bills that have passed one chamber (with Adam Brown, Brigham Young University).

Measuring American State Legislative Policy Agendas Using Machine Learning

This paper uses a machine learning method to code the universe of state legislation since about 2009 by policy area (with Ethan Dee, University of Illinois).
