
The meeting is offered in-person and via Teams at the Waterman - Memorial Lounge Meeting agendas, minutes, and video recordings are also available on our website.



President's 5-year Comprehensive Review

Garimella was chosen for his intellect, his experience, and, most importantly, his vision for how he might use his considerable skills to help UVM realize its full potential. In December 2023, the Board commenced a comprehensive review of President Garimella's first 5 years in accordance with the Board's Presidential Review Policy. I am pleased to write to you all today to describe and summarize the Board's review of his first 5 years. As was true for the Board's most recent comprehensive review of President Tom

Sullivan in 2017, we again engaged Dr. Carol Cartwright, an experienced former

president of two universities, to collect and analyze information from key campus stakeholders. Working directly with me and with five other board members who served as an ad hoc committee to shepherd the review, Dr. Cartwright met with nearly 100 people, including students, faculty, staff, current and former senior leaders, alumni, as well as key community, state, and national partners. fleeing ISIS caught between cruel border guards in both countries; young guards instructed to brutalize and reject the migrants; and activists who aid the refugees




